

To enhance the efficiency and effectiveness of state programs by providing leadership and executive management.


Department Goals

OFFICE OF THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR MAJOR FUNCTIONS

- Exercise the executive powers whenever the Governor is absent from the State or unable to exercise and discharge the powers and duties of the office; serve as the Secretary of State for intergovernmental relations; perform duties and undertake projects assigned by the Governor; and provide administrative support to the Office of Information Practices.
- Provide general advice and guidance to agencies and the public on the UIPA and the Sunshine Law; assist the public in obtaining records and responses to record requests; conduct inquiries into an agency's compliance with the UIPA and the Sunshine Law; and investigate alleged violations of these laws.

A. Program Objective

To enhance the efficiency and effectiveness of State programs by providing leadership and executive management and by developing policies and priorities to give program direction.

- 1. The Lieutenant Governor serves in his capacity on a full-time basis and performs such duties as provided by law (Hawai'i State Constitution, Article V, Section 2). Additionally, the Lieutenant Governor also acts in place of the Governor in the event of the Governor's absence from the State (Hawai'i State Constitution, Article V, Section 4).
- 2. The Lieutenant Governor is also designated Secretary of State for intergovernmental relations. In this capacity, the Lieutenant Governor directs and performs varied activities which are required by law, including: name changes, authentication of documents, sale of official State publications, compilation of administrative rules, compilation of legislative acts and monitoring of state open meeting laws (Section 26-1, HRS).
- 3. The Lieutenant Governor also performs duties and undertakes projects assigned by the Governor. At this time, these duties have centered on the Resources for Enrichment, Athletics, Culture and Health (R.E.A.C.H.) initiative for after-school programs for middle/intermediate school students; the Hawaii Sports Development Initiative; Hawaii Presidential Center initiative; the HI Growth Initiative; liaison for the Governors' Circle with Japan; Aerospace States Association; and International Policy Committee for the National Lieutenant Governors Association, among others (Section 26-1, HRS).

4. The Lieutenant Governor also provides administrative support to agencies attached to this office which include: Office of Information Practices (Section 26-1, HRS).

B. Description of Request

Request \$500,000 to provide continued funding for the Lieutenant Governor's special programs and initiatives, to include the Hawaii Presidential Center, R.E.A.C.H. initiative, the Hawaii Sports Development Initiative, and others, as previously listed.

Request \$60,000 for the establishment of a budgeted position and administrative costs for implementation of Act 277, SLH 2013.

Request \$142,655 for vacation payouts for the Lieutenant Governor and staff during FY 15.

C. Reasons for Request

In March 2013, the Lieutenant Governor announced the R.E.A.C.H. initiative for after-school programs for middle/intermediate school students. With FY 14 funding, the Lieutenant Governor established a pilot program, for which all public middle/intermediate schools were allowed to apply, to help support, enhance or develop after-school programs at their respective schools. Schools were selected and funding will be provided in January 2014. A statewide program is also being developed, which will require time and resources to stand up. Continued funding will allow evaluation of the pilot

program and the potential for extension of the pilot with funding for the awarded schools and/or others, based on performance and need.

Additionally, the Hawaii Presidential Center initiative was undertaken by the Lieutenant Governor following the Regular Session of 2013. Funds were provided to support efforts to secure Hawaii as a potential future location for a Presidential Center for President Barack Obama.

The Lieutenant Governor also plays a significant role in many other initiatives, including, but not limited to, the Sports Development Initiative and HI Growth initiative, serves as a member of the National Lieutenant Governors Association International Policy Committee, liaison for the Governors' Circle with the U.S. Japan Council, the Vice Chair of the Aerospace States Commission, and works closely with the Hawaii Tourism Authority on tourism-related issues, particularly pertaining to Asia Pacific Relations.

Continued funding is required to help support all of the Lieutenant Governor's initiatives and programs, including program costs, administrative costs, travel and other necessary support.

Pursuant to Act 277, SLH 2013, the Office of the Lieutenant Governor is required to establish a process for the Governor to appoint individuals to serve as commissioners of deeds to administer oaths, take acknowledgements, and take proofs of execution outside of the United States in connection with the execution of conveyance documents relating to a time share interest, any property subject to a time share plan, or the operation of a time share plan covering any property located within Hawaii. However, no corresponding position was established to implement the new law, although

funds were provided for the biennium. This request seeks the establishment of an additional position within the office to assist in the duties involved in establishing criteria and an application for appointment as a commissioner of deeds, the drafting of administrative rules to implement the new law, establishment of processes and procedures for the acceptance of cash bonds, if necessary, and as provided in Act 277, SLH 2013, as well as to cover any administrative costs involved in the rulemaking, application, bonding, and appointment processes. This request is not to duplicate funding, but to include funds provided into the Lieutenant Governor's budget.

The final request is in anticipation of a change of Administration as a result of the 2014 Elections. In the event of such change, funding for vacation payouts for the Lieutenant Governor and staff will be necessary during FY 15, and the current budget does not allow for such a substantial payout.

D. Significant Changes to Measures of Effectiveness and Program Size

Requested funding and positions will allow the Lieutenant Governor's Office to more properly and successfully fulfill its constitutional and statutory duties. No significant changes to program size.
