Mission Statement


To conserve, protect, and manage Hawaii's natural and cultural resources for the benefit of present and future generations.

Highlights of the Executive CIP Budget Request: (general obligation bonds unless noted)

- 1. Provides \$1,000,000 for both FY12 and FY13 for energy efficiency and retrofit improvements, statewide.
- 2. Provides \$50,000 in FY12 and \$1,000,000 in FY13 for renovations to the Puuwaawaa Water System.
- 3. Provides \$2,900,000 in FY12 and \$2,220,000 in FY13 for park improvements, statewide.
- 4. Provides \$400,000 in FY 12 and \$1,000,000 in FY13 for harbor improvements to Kikiaola small boat harbor.
